# This Wondrous Place

Evergreen Cemetery was first established in 1856 with the burial of Elizabeth Jane Thomas, infant child of James T. Thomas and his wife Elizabeth Jane Hall Thomas (this grave site marks the historic center of the cemetery). By 1900 the Thomas, Hampton, and Goss families had donated land for cemetery use. In 1944 cemetery grounds were deeded to the City of Gainesville. The historic Evergreen remains the only municipal cemetery in Gainesville.

Evergreen's charm attracts visitors with interests in genealogy, tombstone art, photography, and native plant life. This historic site functions as an outdoor museum with stories of local cultural history experiences unfolding at every turn.

The cultural history of the Evergreen Cemetery is important to our visitors and the community alike. Let this tour be your guide to learn more about Evergreen, as it educates, celebrates and remembers the lives of those interred.
